THE ROSE PRIZE

For original work in the history of general practice in the British Isles

Submissions are now open for the 2019 Rose Prize in the history of general practice.

This prize commemorates William Rose, Apothecary of London, whose court case of 1701-04 established the legal foundation of General Practice in England and Fraser Rose, a co-founder of the Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP).

Submissions are invited from all those with an interest in general practice including historians and lay historians and medical students. The work should be original and specifically written for the Rose Prize but could have been previously published or been part of another project.

Written submissions should be between 3 and 6,000 words. Submissions in other media are welcome. Publication will be encouraged. Any topic on the History of General Practice in the British Isles may be chosen.

The award will be presented at the Spring General Meeting of the Royal College of General Practitioners on Friday 17 May 2019.

The prize consists of a certificate, prize of £200, together with the winner name(s) engraved on the plinth of the Rose Bowl, which they will keep for two years.

'Highly commended' certificates will also be awarded to those applicants meeting the required standard, including one for the best submission by a medical student.
