Call for abstracts

As part of this event, “The Heart, Health and Culture: An exploration in medicine and the humanities” there will be an opportunity for participants to showcase their work and ideas in the form of an abstract and poster. Posters relating to history, theology, philosophy and ethics and the medical humanities broadly are particularly encouraged. Posters must focus on the main theme of the day.

Abstracts should be no more than 300 words, outlining the nature and purpose of poster presentations. Abstracts should include the title of the poster, the names of presenting and other authors, and their professional role and affiliation. They do not have to follow the traditional format of introduction, method, results, conclusions, but they should however be clearly structured and make clear the topic, issue or issues which will be considered, the approach to be taken, and the conclusions drawn. Abstracts will be reviewed by the organising committee. Abstracts accepted for posters will be notified by email by May 29th. Presenters must be registered to attend within a week of acceptance or their work will not be displayed.

Posters should be in the form of a Microsoft PowerPoint Slide in landscape orientation and should be emailed to andrew.papanikitas@gmail.com by 1 week after May 29th. Posters will be displayed on screens during the breaks and lunchtime (and may also be incorporated into the breakout sessions as well) Presenters are asked to be near their poster to discuss their poster with participants for at least half of the lunchtime period. Abstracts and posters that are submitted in good time will be included in a printed handout for delegates.

The deadline for submissions is 6pm on May 22nd 2017. Abstracts should be sent to andrew.papanikitas@gmail.com as in the body of the email or a Microsoft Word document attachment.
