Exploring Medical Ethics creatively can produce compelling writing and shed light on vexed questions in every-day healthcare.

Led by tutors with many years' experience in teaching creative writing and medical ethics, this afternoon course will draw on your own experiences or known cases. Through detailed feedback on your writing, and guided discussions on the ethical issues they raise, we will identify a range of writing techniques (including structure, dialogue, using status relationships and creating suspense) and deepen our understanding of medical ethics.

Helen Mosby teaches Creative and Reflective Writing at Oxford University Medical School and at the Open University. She has written fiction, performs her own comedy, and is developing a new method of Narrative Professional Reflection for doctors and medical students.

Andrew Papanikitas is director of the course in philosophy of medicine at the Society of Apothecaries and winner of both a BMA writing and BMA book award. He is also a general practitioner and experienced medical teacher.
