FRIULI VENEZIA GIULIA

MONDAY 10TH MAY TO SATURDAY 15TH MAY, 2021





Friuli Venezia Giulia at the north-eastern end of the Adriatic, is a cluster of Italian provinces between the Alps and the coast, bordered by Slovenia and Austria. Settled in prehistoric times by the Castellieri civilisation, and in the 4th century BC by Celtic tribes, from the 2nd century BC, Friuli was colonised by the Romans - Aquileia was the fourth largest city of Italy, and the first area in Italy to adopt Christianity. After the fall of the Western Roman Empire, the Patriarchate of Aquileia was one of the highest ecclesiastic authorities in Italy. Cividale (originally founded by Julius Caesar around 50BC) later become one of the main centres of the Lombard kingdom. The conquests of Charlemagne (748-814AD) brought it into the Frankish Empire and after centuries of war the province was divided between Venice and the Austrian Hapsburgs. All these invaders and settlers shaped the culture of the area and this tour will explore the art and architecture they left, in this most lovely and secluded region of Italy where we visit some of Italy's most beautiful villages.

We will stay 5 nights at the 4 star Hotel Astoria in central Udine, which was a residential villa in the 14th century. After a succession of aristocratic owners, the building was transformed into an elegant hotel, initially named "Gran Hotel Europa" and then "Grande Albergo d'Italia".

OUR PROGRAMME

DAY 1 Monday 10 May

Easyjet Priority Boarding: dep Gatwick 1230; arr Venice 1540. Transfer to Hotel, dinner in the hotel.

DAY 2 Tuesday 11 May: Aquileia, Grado & Palmanova



Aquileia was founded in 181 BC as a Roman military and trading centre with a harbour connecting it to its seaport in Grado. We visit the Romanesque-Gothic basilica complex with a lovely C4th floor mosaic and two crypts with further floor mosaics as well as C12th frescoes. We go on to explore the remains of the

roman river port, and the Archaeological Museum. We <u>lunch</u> before driving along the causeway to **Grado**, a small island which was an important port in Roman times, and later served as a refuge for those fleeing the many invasions which ended the Roman empire. We visit the C6th Basilica of Sant' Eufemia, which also has lovely floor mosaics, and the C6th Basilica of Santa Maria delle Grazie. On the way back to Udine we will visit Palmanova, a splendid example of a fortified late renaissance bastion town built by the Venetians in 1593, and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Dinner in the hotel.

DAY 3 Wednesday 12 May: Cividale & Udine

At the end of the C6th Cividale became the capital of the first Lombard duchy in Italy and is now a World Heritage site. We visit the Cathedral, the Cathedral museum, the Archaeological Museum and the Tempietto Longobardo. Lunch in Cividale before returning to Udine, where the afternoon is spent on foot visiting the main sites of this small and charming town. Visits include the Cathedral and Baptistery and the Galleria Tiepolo. Evening at leisure.



DAY 4 Thursday 13 May: Trieste

A sea-port city, and the capital of Friuli, **Trieste** is situated between the Adriatic Sea and Slovenia. Its history has been shaped by its location at the crossroads of Latin, Slavic, and Germanic cultures. Settled since ancient times, its heyday was as the most important Hapsburg seaport and the fourth largest city of the Empire. At the time of the C19th fin de siècle, Trieste was an important centre for literature and music, and then played an important role in the East/West struggle after the end of the second World War. We visit the Cathedral of San Giusto with some surviving Byzantine mosaics, and walk through the C18th Hapsburg Borgo Teresiano, visiting the Serbian Orthodox church of San Spiridone and the Greek Orthodox church of San Nicolo. We will end the morning with a visit to the superb collection of 19-20th century painting and sculpture in Museo Revoltella in the mansion of a 19th century businessman. Lunch is provided. In the afternoon we drive around the Bay of **Trieste** to the promontory of Grignano where we visit the *Castello Miramare*, built in the later C19th for Archduke Ferdinand Maximillian of Hapsburg. Dinner in the hotel

DAY 5 Friday 14 May: Pordenone, Spilimbergo & Portogruaro

A day spent visiting some of the typical towns of Friuli, picturesque and colourful. In the morning we drive to **Pordenone**, the so-called "painted town", due to its frescoed palaces, its churches, and its painted squares (it is also famous for chocolate). We will then drive to **Spilimbergo** to visit the outstanding school of mosaics for a brief lecture and watch some students at work. *Lunch* is provided, and in the afternoon, we visit **Portogruaro**, a pretty town with a Venetian feel to it due to its elegant palaces. You will be free to wander around the town. *Farewell dinner* at local restaurant.

Morning hotel check out, and departure at 10:00. We drive north west of Udine for a visit to the medieval **Castello di Villalta**, (shown below) set on a hillside with fabulous views towards Udine and considered one of the most beautiful castles in the region. <u>Lunch</u> will be provided en route to the airport.
