

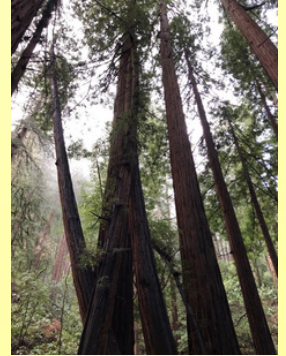

Epistemic Injustice in Schizophrenia

Patients with schizophrenia suffer epistemic injustice when they are afforded unduly low levels of credibility by their caregivers, and when representations of their experiences are prejudicially excluded from the collective means of social interpretation.

This lecture will consider the nature of epistemic injustice in caregiving in schizophrenia, how it causes patients and caregivers to miss out on knowledge, and its negative implications for outcomes. It will also consider which tools are available to caregivers pursuing epistemic justice for schizophrenia patients.
