Abstracts should be no more than 300 words, outlining the nature and purpose of the poster. Abstracts should include the title of the poster, the names of presenting and other authors, and their professional role and affiliation.

Deadline for abstract submissions is Friday, 14 April 2021

Abstracts should be sent to facultyhp@apothecaries.org with the subject line "Botany poster abstract" and the abstract as a Microsoft Word document attachment.

Abstracts will be reviewed by the organising committee, and those accepted will be notified by email by Monday, 22 April 2021.
