Terms and conditions: Course registration and Fee payment for attendees on the Courses *(Short courses and Diploma)*

The annual courses will be held online and in-person from October 2021-June 2022 and then in the locations and venues as stated. All is subject to change

Course Fees – October 2021 – June 2022

Full-time students	£630	Course fees Payable before the first day of the course.
Others	£975	
Taster Days	£80 per lecture day – A maximum of 2, on the first and / or second lecture days of the academic year only. N.B. The sums paid may be credited towards the full fee if an individual registers for a course.	
Drop-in sessions	If you wish to attend drop-in sessions throughout the year, an application form and payment will need to be completed and sent to the Faculty one week before the course day is due.	
Missed Lectures	Lectures missed in the year for which registration has been made (or equivalent lectures if the titles are not available) may be attended in the following year. Two such days (which will be the equivalent to 4 sessions if attending missed sessions) may be attended without additional charge but thereafter a fee of £80 will apply for each additional day.	

Application acceptance

The application form and the terms and conditions must be completed and signed when applying. If you are claiming full-time student status, please include supporting documentation from your higher education institution.

Fees and Payment

The full payment of the course needs to be made and cleared before attending the first session of the academic year. The Faculty accepts payments via the [shop](#) or bank transfers and net funds bank transfers, all in sterling; we regret additional banking costs by other currencies needs to be paid by the applicant.

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Cancellations and refunds

Cancellations should be made in writing.

Cancellations received more than 14 days before the first day of the course will receive a full refund. We regret later cancellations will incur an administrative fee of £25.00, and attendance on the course up until the point of correspondence with the Faculty will be deducted from the amount to be refunded.

Changing Course

Students who wish to transfer to another course within 4 weeks of the start of the course for which they have registered will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The outcome will depend in part, upon whether there is a place available on the other course.

Attendance Requirement

Attendance is recorded at the course days, both in-person or online by the Faculty Manager or Course Director. It is expected that students attend live course days but recordings of lectures will be available for catch-up.
