#### APPLICATIONS

1. To avoid disappointment, candidates are advised to apply for the examination well in advance of the closing date for entries, and to ensure that their complete electronic application (i.e. form and full fee – see also paragraph 4) arrives in the Examinations Office by the deadline date and time. The deadline is the **final** date/time that a completed application can be considered for entry to the examination **but there is no guarantee that places will still be available at this date**. Please note that an application is only deemed complete when it includes all relevant documents and the correct fee.
2. Although 2 OSCE dates are shown, the OSCE examination may be held on only one of the days stated.

#### WAITING LIST

3. Owing to the uncertainties that possible Covid-19 pandemic restrictions continues to pose, we are conscious that availability of candidate places may be more limited than usual. A decision has been made to set-aside our first-come-first-served approach in relation to entry to this exam, so that applications from current GU Specialty trainees where possible, will be given priority over non-GU trainees on this occasion. Offers of secured entries remain in place for known candidates previously deferred.

The Society will operate a waiting list system if an exam becomes oversubscribed. Candidates will be notified in writing as soon as a place becomes available, and given a short period in which to respond. Please note that should candidates not respond within this time, the place will be offered to the next person on the waiting list.

#### EXAMINATION FEE

4. The examination:

Full Exam entry (**OSCE & Bo5**) **£1000 NET**    Partial entry (**OSCE only**) **£600 NET**    Partial entry (**Bo5 only**) **£400 NET**  
The above fees relate to first time or re-entry fees

**N.B.** This is the amount payable to the Society; any transaction charges must borne by the candidate. Candidates who withdraw from the examination after the closing date will trigger a forfeit fee as detailed below.

*OSCE exam appears first in the schedule; with the Bo5 following approx. 6 to 8 weeks later. You are able able to apply for each component independently if you so wish.*

#### OSCE PREFERENCES

5. Candidates may express their preference for a specific OSCE session on the application form. Whilst we will endeavour to meet that preference, indication of a preference does not guarantee a place for that session. Sessions will be allocated on a first-come first-served basis and will be confirmed on the admission document,

**THE EXAMINATION**

6. The examination is mapped to the **Specialty Training Curriculum for Genitourinary Medicine** issued by the Joint Royal College of Physicians Training Board.
7. All equipment is provided, both for the written paper and the OSCE.

**WITHDRAWING FROM THE EXAMINATION**

8. Candidates who wish to withdraw from the examination must notify the Society in writing. The following withdrawal penalties will be applied:
