Up Close and Medical: Behind the Scenes at London's Medical Museums 3 Day Course

Course outline

Exploring both the places and people that have put London at the centre of medicine, this course will take you behind the scenes of London's finest medical museums to discover extraordinary stories and objects that have shaped how medicine is practised and experienced from the past until today. From herbs to heart surgery, public health to paramedics, drug jars to dentistry, exploring London's museums provides remarkable insights into humanity's age-long campaign for good health.

Attending this course you will:

- Gain a better sense of history of medicine with a focus on the health challenges faced by Londoners past and present
- Get behind the scenes access to incredible places of medical history
- Get hands on with extraordinary objects

Day 1 – Wednesday, 6 July 2022

Science Museum

10am Welcome and Introduction to the Course and the Science Museum – Katie Dabin

Meet team members responsible for the <u>Medicine Galleries</u>, with talks and a workshop exploring Curating Medicine at the Science Museum, and Collecting & Exhibiting Public

Health, plus a curator-led tour of the galleries themselves.

Day 2 – Thursday, 7 July 2022

Old Operating Theatre Museum and Herb Garret, 9a St Thomas's Street

9.20 am <u>The Old Operating Theatre</u> - Arrival and Welcome – Dr Anna Simmons

9.30am Housed in the attic of the early eighteenth-century church of the old St Thomas' Hospital,

this atmospheric museum offers a unique insight into the history of medicine and surgery. Learn about 'Surgery before anaesthesia' from the Old Operating Theatre team , and about 'Developments in Anaesthesia' from the Association of Anaesthetists, while sitting in the oldest surviving surgical theatre in Europe. We then have exclusive access to the venue to

further investigate its displays.

11 am to 12 pm Travel to Fitzroy Square

12 to 1.30 pm British Cardiovascular Society (BCS), 9 Fitzroy Square

Our visit to the BCS museum in the Society's centenary year will provide a unique insight into British Cardiology and the way it has shaped the development of cardiovascular medicine across the world. Housed in the Society's offices at 9 Fitzroy Square, the collection was the brainchild of Dr Arthur Hollman (1923-2014) who personally donated or sourced many of the exhibits. Enjoy a guided

tour, a talk by Dr Caroline Coats (Honorary Archivist) and a chance to get hands on with items from the collection.

2.30 pm

Royal College of Nursing (RCN), 20 Cavendish Square

The Royal College of Nursing Library and Archive is also celebrating 100 years in 2022. Our visit includes a tour of the historic RCN building, 20 Cavendish Square built in 1729, with its most famous resident Liberal MP Herbert Henry Asquith, who lived here until he became prime minister in 1908. We will also see the current exhibition *Who Cares? A History of Emotions in Nursing*.

Day 3 - Friday, 8 July 2022

Apothecaries' Hall

10 am

After an introductory talk from Briony Hudson explaining "Why aren't apothecaries pharmacists and pharmacists apothecaries?", explore Apothecaries' Hall on a tour with Dr John Ford. Steeped in history and tradition the Society of Apothecaries was founded by Royal Charter in 1617 and 2022 sees 350 years since the completion of rebuilding after the Great Fire of London. It is one of the few livery companies in the City of London to remain professionally based and its Hall in Blackfriars provides a unique insight into the evolution of medical practice in the city.

Take the chance to get up close to specially-selected objects and archives from the Society's collections with Briony Hudson and Dr Anna Simmons.

Royal College of Physicians Garden

2 - 3.30pm

Guided visit of the Royal College of Physicians Garden of Medicinal Plants led by Garden Fellows Dr Henry Oakley and Dr John Newton. The garden contains over 1,100 plants, all with links to medicine, which tell myriad stories from diverse cultures, different countries and from every age in recorded history.
