





THOMAS GUY,  
FOUNDER OF GUY'S HOSPITAL.

*Conferring with Dr. Mead the Physician & Mr. Dear the Architect upon the Plan for the Building.*

*Sprint*, Executors of this my said last Will, on Trust, as aforesaid.

And my mind and will is, that until such incorporation, by letters patent, or Act of Parliament, as herein after directed, can be obtained and take effect, they my said Executors and last mentioned Trustees, their heirs, executors, administrators and Assigns; and afterwards such Corporation shall and do, out of the *Residuum* of my Estate, or the rents, interest, or other profits thereof, carry on, erect, finish, and fit up the two new Squares of Building in *Southwark*, by me some time since began and intended for an Hospital, for the reception of such sick Persons as are herein after mentioned; and such other erections, offices, and Buildings, as shall, in the opinion of my said Executors and Trustees, be for that purpose further necessary; and also provide and furnish the same with beds and all other conveniences for the reception of, and receive and entertain therein, four hundred poor persons or upwards,

receive and entertain therein, four hundred poor persons or upwards, labouring under any distempers, infirmities or disorders




